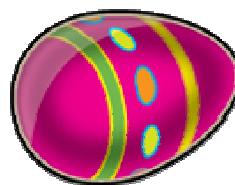
We welcome back Ms Mary Flinn from Long Service Leave to resume her position working in our wellbeing area.

## EASTER MESSAGE

We have now come to the climax of our Lenten journey. We are about to take part in the final earthly journey with Jesus. Holy Thursday Night gives us the opportunity to come together and celebrate the last supper, then on Good Friday we have the passion of and death of Jesus. ## RESPECT

A few weeks ago, I wrote about respect and its importance within the College community. St Joseph's College is a wonderful place to work and learn, but our College will be a happier and more vibrant community when we have strong positive relationships throughout. A lack of respect is toxic to strong positive relationships.

I spoke to students about the issues of positive relationships and respect at the College Assembly last week. What most concerned me was a number of cases where there has been a lack of respect for a teacher who has made reasonable requests in a rational manner.

Often we do not consider the impact of our actions. I remember reading some research by psychologists a few years ago, who worked out that in human relationships, it can take over 12 positive experiences to overcome one negative experience. A harsh word or a criticism can undo a lot of positive work.

We can all fail when we don't respect others and I include myself in this - none of us are perfect. In order to work through these issues, however, it is often important that the person who has been disrespectful is faced with the impact of how their actions affect others. Most students recognize when they have done the right thing and their remorse is a strong indication of a willingness to change their behaviours.

I want to make it clear, however, that there are always consequences for our actions and people who

consistently fail to show respect will face strong consequences. Consistent disrespect can have such a negative impact on our community that I would be remiss in my role as Deputy Principal if I did not support strong action to deal with those who regularly fail to respect others.

## ELLEN SANDELL

Pat Riordan, Director of Staff, attended a civic reception held in Ellen's honour on Friday, 13<sup>th</sup> March. Ellen spoke very fondly of her time at St Joseph's College and felt that she could not have had better teachers whilst at the College. Apart from completing a Double Degree in Science and Arts, she has also fitted in many extra curricular activities. Below is the article from Ellen Sandell:

*I attended St Joseph's College from 1997 to 2002. Growing up near the river, I always had a passion for the environment, and being involved in Young St Vinnies and other activities at school also fostered a passion for social justice. When I started my schooling at the University of Melbourne I learned about climate change, and the impact that it would have on the environment and our lives, and I became very concerned. In 2007, I was selected to attend the United Nations climate change talks in Bali. I joined over 200 other young people from around the world lobbying for stronger government action on climate change. I also met people who are already being affected by climate change, such as Ursula from the Carteret Islands in Papua New Guinea. She is already having to move her whole village of 2000 people to the mainland because rising sea levels are affecting their crops and drinking water. I also attended the UN talks in Poland last year. Now I am working for the Australian Youth Climate Coalition, helping to organise our massive youth climate summit, Power Shift in July and running the schools program, where we travel around the country running climate change conferences for high school students. Last year I was lucky enough to be awarded the Pride of Australia Young Aussie medal for Victoria and was also a finalist in the Young Australian of the Year Awards.*

## A THOUGHT FROM THE URSULA FRAYNE WELL-BEING CENTRE

Here are five GOOD questions to ask your son/daughter:

- 1. Ask specific, not general questions:** Rather than asking your son/daughter, "How was school today?" (general question) which gives them little choice, try asking specific questions such as, "What was something new you did today?" or "Where are you at with that new art project you began last week?" Specific questions indicate real interest and in fact are real questions.
- 2. Ask for a solution:** If your son/daughter tells you to stop nagging about cleaning up their bedrooms, ask them for their solution - e.g. "Okay, so how would you go about keeping it clean?" This opens the door for negotiation and places responsibility on them to be involved in the solution.
- 3. Ask specific questions to get information:** If your son/daughter is upset by something that has happened, there are times when you just have to get more information. "Can you tell me what happened?" "What was it that upset you?" Sometimes being listened to is all young adults need.

- 4. Consult with your son/daughter:** Ask questions that tap into and broaden your son/daughter's self-knowledge. "When do you feel you can do your best homework?" Teenagers know from the cradle what they need so let's tap into that knowledge.
- 5. Ask what they would like to change:** If your son/daughter complains about something specific, such as their sibling's behaviour or school, ask them what they would like to change. "If you could change one thing about school what would it be?" This can often open up a range of conversational options.

There is no script or easy to remember set of rules to follow when talking with your son/daughter, however, these questions are easy-to-use tools that you can use when you and your son/daughter need to gain a better understanding of each other, or just an exploration of better behavioural options.

- Speak to your son/daughter calmly and carefully
- Support teachers and school rules
- Talk and listen to your son/daughter
- Be encouraging
- Don't nag or criticize
- Don't argue back
- Make yourself redundant - let them stack the dishwasher, tidy up
- Show affection - say 'I love you', give a hug
- Have family meetings weekly to air issues
- Expect chores to be done for no money
- Set boundaries and consequences and stick to them
- Pick your battles
- Set the example
